 - a) What factors led to the European Renaissance? Briefly discuss the impact of the Renaissance on English Literature and Culture.
 - b) Assess the contributions of the major predecessors of Shakespeare to Elizabethan Drama.
 - c) Give an account of the major trends in Post-Shakespearean drama and account for its decline.

- d) Examine the development of the form of the essay with special reference to the essays of Francis Bacon.
- e) Discuss Marlowe's *Edward II* as a Tragedy.
- f) Discuss the chief features of Metaphysical Poetry with illustrative references to the poems you have read.
- 2. Answer any *three* of the following: $12 \times 3 = 36$
 - a) Show how any two of the natural phenomena mentioned in 'Virtue' are balanced against the moral quality of virtue.
 - b) Critically analyse the sleepwalking scene in *Macbeth*.
 - c) Is Sidney's 'Loving in Truth' a poem about love or about the conventions of writing poetry?
 - d) Analyse the role of Touchstone in As You Like It.
 - e) Discuss the roles of Gaveston and Spenser in Marlowe's *Edward II*.
 - f) What was the Reformation ? How did it affect English Society ?

- g) Discuss the history of Bible translations in England.
- h) Critically examine Sidney's arguments about the superiority of poetry over the other branches of knowledge.
- 3. Answer any *four* of the following: $6 \times 4 = 24$
 - a) Write a note on the Comedy of Humours.
 - b) What role did the playhouses and patrons play in the development of Elizabethan drama?
 - c) Identify and explain two different figures of speech in 'On His Blindness'.
 - d) Explain "But thy eternal summer shall not fade".
 - e) What does Bacon say about fountains in a garden?
 - f) What does Jesus say about one's attitude to one's enemies in "The Sermon on the Mount"?
 - g) Explain "Fair is foul and foul is fair".
